

# What to Bring to Your Initial Family Law Appointment

### **GENERAL**

- Details about you, your former partner and children (full names, dob, addresses (if known))
- Relevant dates (or approximate dates) such as dates of co-habitation, marriage, separation
- Any court documents (including any previous orders or parenting plans), binding financial agreements or child support agreements or correspondence you have received or sent or filed
- Some clients find it useful to make some notes about the issues they have been having and listing the questions they would like answered
- Details of any agreement reached with your former partner

## **PROPERTY MATTERS**

- List of the assets and liabilities of you and your spouse
- Be prepared to given an overview about what each of you had at the commencement of relationship, what happened during the relationship and after separation (if there has been some time or significant developments with assets has occurred after separation)

# **KIDS MATTERS**

- If you have been issued with section 60l certificate (mediation certificate), please bring a copy of the certificate
- Be prepared to give an overview of the arrangements that have occurred after separation and what brings you to see us.

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
